



Chilly Breeze Capelette

This capelette can be made with any yarn, and at any gauge, making it a perfect project for handspun yarn.

† I used approximately 1200 yards of 2-ply, 14 wpi yarn.

† I used a †US size 4 (3.5mm), 60" cable needle.

† It measures 27" from neck to waist.

† Finished weight approximately 500 grams or 1 pound.





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In this pattern, I provide basic instructions for how to make this shawl which can easily be modified.

Once there are 27 stitches, this capelette simply requires 8 increases every other row to make the spit cape shape.

I like the method of beginning with 5 stitches at the neck and increasing to 27 stitches because it gives that area of the shawl some density.

Cast on 5 stitches.

Row 1- Knit 1 (K1), Make 1 (M1) in each of following stitches by knitting in front and back (KFB) of each stitch. (9 stitches)

Row 2 - Knit across.

Row 3 - M1 in each of the stitches. (18 stitches).

Row 4 - Knit across.

Row 5 - Knit 1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB, K1, KFB. (27 stitches)

Row 6 - Knit across.



Place Markers - Place one marker after every 3 stitches (see photo). I advise using two colors of stitch markers because it will make the rest of the increases easy to remember.

Row 7 - Knit 3, slip marker - SM-1, Yarn Over (YO), knit to next marker, SM-2, YO, knit to next marker, SM-3, YO, knit to next marker, SM-4, YO, knit to next marker, YO, SM-5, knit to next marker, YO, SM-6, knit to next marker, YO, SM-7, knit to next marker, YO, SM-8, K3.

Row 8 - Knit across.

Repeat Row 7 and Row 8. When the capelette reaches a desired length, add a few rows of seed stitches or any desired border. Bind off with your preferred method.
